Summary Comments

(on the forms submitted by the School of Tourism and Hospitality Management)

The University Curriculum Committee has concluded the evaluation of the Program Forms submitted by the School of Tourism and Hospitality Management.

The members went through these programs and concluded by June 6 (see the attached reports) that the program revisions are acceptable subject to some modifications of the relevant Program Revision Forms. The Committee however made some additional remarks, in addition to the remarks summarized in the attached checklists, itemized below:

- The Committee also made the observation that the common courses offered by the Other Departments can cause an integrity problem in future (mismatch due to contradicting information relevant to a single course). To avoid this problem in future, a possible remedy can be to leave these sections (*Part VIII* for Program Revision Forms and *Part V* for New Program Proposal Forms) blank.
- Evaluation of present resources, additional facilities, extra staff, etc. are beyond the work definition of UCC. STHM has proposed to increase the academic staff size considerably as well as additional facilities. Justification of these requests might be necessary. UCC is in no position to make a judgment on this issue.

UCC appreciates the amount of massive work completed by the STHM.
